## Examination performance in 2020

## GCSE Results 2020

No exams took place in summer 2020 due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. To enable students to receive qualifications, it was announced that students who were due to sit A level or GCSE exams in summer 2020 would receive a calculated grade. For each student, schools have provided a centre assessment grade for each subject; this is the grade their school believes they would be most likely to have achieved had exams gone ahead, taking into account a range of evidence including, for example, non-exam assessment and mock results

Ofqual confirmed that there no longer would be a standardisation process for AS and A levels or GCSEs and instead all students will be awarded the centre assessment grade submitted by their school, unless it is lower than their calculated grade in which case the calculated grade will stand. Unless there is evidence that a processing error has been made, these grades will be final.

Students will be able to use the grades they receive in the summer 2020 to move on to their next step.
We are delighted with the results of our Y11 cohort 2020, all of whom have now progressed to places at either Post 16, local colleges, apprenticeships and other Post 16 providers.

## Overall

67\% of students gained a 4+ (standard pass) in English and Mathematics combined. 39\% gained a grade 5+ or above in English and Mathematics combined. This is 4\% above national for 2019.
$34.39 \%$ of the cohort were entered for the English Baccalaureate/EBacc. $94.44 \%$ of this cohort achieved a band 4+ in this suit of qualifications. $66.66 \%$ of this cohort achieved a grade $5+$. The Government refers to this as a 'strong' pass. The academy's $34.39 \%$ entry rate into EBacc qualification is above the all Rotherham schools figure of 23\%. The Ebacc average point score was 4.06, this is above national averages for 2020.

## GCSE English Language and Literature.

77.07\% of all students gained a grade 4+ in English
52.87\% of students gained a grade 5+ and 16.56\% gained a grade 7+ in English

This is above national data and the average data for other Rotherham schools.

## GCSE Mathematics

72.61\% of all students gained a grade 4+ in Maths
47.13\% of students gained a grade 5+ and 16.56\% gained a 7+ in Maths

Like English, this is above both the national and Rotherham averages.

## Progress 8 score

The progress 8 score for Swinton Academy was a positive +0.2 . This is in line with the national average. We are very pleased with the progress that was made by our Y11 cohort of 2020.

## Post 11 Destination measures

At Swinton Academy we are committed to ensuring that students leave with the necessary skills and qualifications to access Post 16 education or training. 2017 data shows that 134 of the 136 ( $98.5 \%$ ) students who progressed from Y11 at Swinton Academy went into full time education or training. In 2018 129/134 (96.2\%) students from Y11 at Swinton Academy went into full time education or training.

In 2019, all Y11 students from Swinton Academy successfully progressed into full time education or training. The NEET figure for students leaving in summer 2020 is $98.7 \%$. All these figures are well above the Rotherham average of $93 \%$ and that of State funded schools in England, which is $94 \%$. We are extremely proud of these successes.
